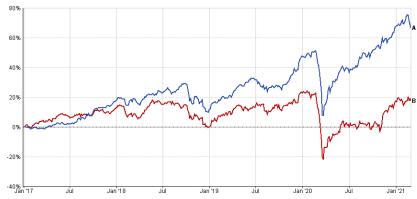

Fund Objective and Strategy

The investment objective of the fund is to seek to maximise total returns over the long term, defined as five to ten years. The fund will invest mainly in a portfolio of UK equities listed on the LSE or quoted on AIM/ISDX, with an emphasis on small and mid-capitalised companies. It may also invest in other transferable securities, money market instruments, units and/or shares in other collective investment schemes, deposits, warrants, cash and near cash. The manager will follow the methodology of Business Perspective Investing and it is expected that the portfolio will contain between 25 and 40 holdings when fully invested.

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Fund Commentary

Free Spirit's income share price fell by 1.63% in February against the 1.66% rise in the wider UK market. We missed out, although not wistfully, on the continuing rally in the prices of mining, oil and gas and banking companies which remain as incompatible as ever with our Business Perspective Investing process. A stumble in tech valuations worked against us too, as did Sterling's c.2.5% gain against the US dollar and the rise in bond yields, impacting our large cap overseas earners such as Unilever, Relx, Aveva and Intertek. Our biggest three losers were Bloomsbury Publishing (-12.1%, retracing after its sharp upward spike on the last day of the preceding month), Avon Rubber (11.0% - further reflecting January's profit warning and Sterling's new-found strength) and Unilever (-10.7%). Our three biggest gainers were Mortgage Advice Bureau (+7.4%), London Stock Exchange (+12.8%) and MJ Gleeson (+12.9% to when sold).

Unilever reported mixed results for pandemic-struck 2020, as we would expect for such a broad portfolio of consumer brands selling into such a wide range of geographic markets. Cleaning, hygiene and in-home food categories broadly performed strongly, while sales to the food service sector (hotels, restaurants and caterers) suffered from lockdowns. Progress continues with evolving the portfolio towards higher growth segments such as prestige beauty, functional nutrition and plant-based foods. Interim results from Tristel highlighted the two-speed nature of selling to hospitals during a pandemic; demand for surface disinfectants grew, while sales of medical device disinfectants were dented by the suspension of non-essential patient examinations. Geographic expansion continues with the establishment of a new subsidiary in Malaysia and the appointment of a new distributor in India, potentially a very large market. Tristel reported 15% revenue growth, gross margin expansion, a strong cash position (it has no debt) and a 12% increase in the interim dividend.

Net inflows to the fund of £16.7m in February were mostly invested. Cash increased to 18.1% following disposals of Victrex and MJ Gleeson and receipt of the cash offer proceeds for our holding in Codemasters, an involuntary disposal of a business which had delivered a c.66% return in just a few months.
